Note on B.I.1 'Navigation'

The PowerPoint presentation states that at 12:00 noon the sun is standing at due south. There are two important reservations to this statement, however. One, as noted in the PowerPoint, is that during Daylight Saving Time noon is officially redefined: the clock's hands point to 12:00 while the sun is already moved on past.

The other reservation is that our clocks and watches are fixed to time zones, broad bands in which the time is officially set to a declared standard. The sun knows nothing about these. So while Dublin and Galway are both in the same time zone, in fact, the sun passes over Dublin rather sooner than it does over Galway, and so reaches due south a good bit earlier.
